Licensure earned after January 1, 2024, will be determined by a master's degree in counseling that is defined as a single conferred/awarded master's degree in counseling from a CACREP accredited program, consisting of a minimum of sixty (60) graduate semester hours, or ninety (90) graduate quarter hours at a regionally accredited College or university. No less than these hourly requirements and academic areas in a single program will be accepted.
